The BCSWomen undergraduate Lovelace colloquium

16 June 2008, Leeds UK.

Named after the computing pioneer Ada Lovelace, this event will feature a poster competition with **real cash prizes (2x£100 first prizes)** for women undergraduate students, and talks from leading academics and women in the computing industry.

The aims of the event are:

- To provide a forum for undergraduate women to share their ideas and network
- To provide a stimulating series of talks from women in computing, both from academia and industry
- To provide both formal (talks) and informal (networking) advice to undergraduate women about careers in computing from a female perspective

If institutions are unable to support their own students' attendance, bursaries (up to £50 per poster presenter, depending upon where you're coming from) are available to assist with **Travel costs.**

If members of staff involved in project work wish to attend to support their students they will be most welcome (please notify us early though!). The Active Learning in Computing CETL is supporting this event, and can arrange a parallel session for university staff if demand is high.
