

Women computing undergraduates are invited to submit 250 word abstracts to...

The BCSWomen undergraduate Lovelace colloquium

16 June 2008, Leeds UK.

Named after the computing pioneer Ada Lovelace, this event will feature a poster competition with **real cash prizes (2x£100 first prizes)** for women undergraduate students, and talks from leading academics and women in the computing industry. Industrial sponsors (such as Google) will be sending recruiters and engineers so if you want to find out what it's like to work for a big company, this will be a good chance.

The aims of the event are:

- To provide a forum for undergraduate women to share their ideas and network
- To provide a stimulating series of talks from women in computing, both from academia and industry
- To provide both formal (talks) and informal (networking) advice to undergraduate women about careers in computing from a female perspective

Bursaries (up to £50 per poster presenter, depending upon where you're coming from) are available to assist with **Travel costs**.

To attend, submit an abstract of up to 250 words on either

- **Your final year project work ... or**
- **A computing topic you have covered as part of your course**

The best abstracts will be invited to come to the colloquium. Deadline for abstracts: April 30. In the event of oversubscription, the best abstracts will get the travel money, so make it good!
